

Georgia Department of Revenue – Motor Vehicle Division Title Ad Valorem Tax Informational Bulletin Vehicles Donated to 501(c)(3) Non-Profit Organizations

Effective April 9, 2014

PURPOSE

The purpose of this bulletin is to announce a clarification of O.C.G.A. § 48-5C-1(d)(13) pertaining to vehicles donated to 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations that are titled in the name of the non-profit organization.

POLICY

Georgia Code Section 48-5C-1(d)(13) allows for 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations to title donated motor vehicles in their name at a 1% rate of TAVT instead of the ordinary rate; e.g., 6.75 % in 2014, 7% in 2015, etc. The statute requires that the motor vehicle ultimately be transferred to another person. At the same time, the statute does not prohibit the non-profit organization from registering and using the motor vehicle for its own use nor does the statute provide a required time frame between the time of donation and the subsequent transfer.

Due to the lack of an enforceable standard, and to promote consistent treatment of all 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations, county tag offices shall process <u>all</u> title applications for a motor vehicle <u>donated</u> to a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization at the 1% rate of TAVT. In order to receive the reduced rate, the non-profit organization should execute Form MV-31 and provide it to the county tag office when applying for a Certificate of Title in the name of the non-profit organization.

Please note, for motor vehicles <u>purchased</u> by 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations (as opposed to <u>donated</u> to the organization) the ordinary TAVT rate applies; e.g., 6.75% for 2014, 7% for 2015, etc. In either instance, having been subject to TAVT the non-profit organization will receive the associated exemption from sales tax and the annual ad valorem tax.
