Dear [REDACTED]:

I have carefully considered your Protest and Claim for Refund on intangible recording tax penalties and interest paid to the Clerk of Superior Court, [REDACTED] when you recorded a Security Deed between the parties on May 3, 2005. Your letter dated June 3, 2005, your Protest, your Claim for Refund and all supporting documentation were considered. It is my determination that your Protest and Claim for Refund with request for waiver of penalties in the amount of [REDACTED] is denied. The amount may not be refunded.

The proximate cause for the failure to timely record the instrument between the parties was failure to exercise proper diligence, rather than inadvertence or ignorance of the law. Having an adequate system of follow-up could have prevented the assessment of penalties.
