

WHAT IS DRIVES?

The Georgia Department of Revenue (DOR) and the Georgia Department of Driver Services (DDS) are collaborating on a Request for Proposal (RFP) to modernize the Tag & Title system (GRATIS) as well as the Driver's License system (DDLS).

WHY IS DRIVES NECESSARY?

The GRATIS and DDLS systems are being replaced because they are mainframe-based. The technology they are based on is in decline and expensive to maintain.

STATUS:

- The procurement for DRIVES has been extended. As this is a multi-agency project, the state of Georgia is continuing to perform due diligence prior to selecting a winning vendor for the RFP. In the interim, other DRIVES-related activities are continuing to occur.
- ◆ The DRIVES Data Project team is working on ways to clean up data within the GRATIS system. Duplicate data is being reviewed within the system, and will be merged together where appropriate. The data retention schedule will also be used by the team in order to make data-related decisions.
- ◆ The DRIVES Organization Change Management (OCM) project team is documenting existing processes. These processes exist at both the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) as well as the county tag offices (CTO). Documenting these processes will be useful once the contract has been awarded so that DOR can determine how existing processes/workflows may be impacted by the new DRIVES software.
